And now we pray that we may have the determination and courage to be peacemakers and ambassadors of reconciliation in a world torn by war and conflict. Grant us the grace to live compassionately in bringing your love to the disrespected and hurting members of society, both at home and abroad. May our beloved land, once again, become "Your dominion from sea to sea." May we return to those principles of faith, hope and love that made this country great in the beginning. A nation contrite in heart, keenly sensitive to all the unsolved injustice and sins still in our midst. Remind us that what is wrong with our country is the sum total of all that is wrong with us as individuals. Our country can never be changed until we, her citizens, are changed, and may it begin in each heart.
